State: Collapsed slide overloaded, uninspected

An inflatable slide that collapsed at an elementary school carnival earlier this week had never been inspected, had too many children on it and may have been improperly anchored, state officials said Thursday. Investigators also said employees from the Asheville-based Master Rental

Inc. did not file a notice of insurance on the slide, inform the state they planned to set up inflatable rides at First Ward Elementary School,

or submit a form showing operators were properly trained to supervise the slide.

The notices, according to Clyde Wagner, who heads the N.C. Elevator and Amusement Device Bureau, are required under state law. The bureau is a division of the N.C. Labor Department.

Owers from Master Rental Inc., which set up the carnival, and Mountain Marketing, which owns the equipment, told state investigators in Asheville Thursday they didn't know about the laws.

"I find it almost unbelievable that rental companies that lease inflatable carnival rides would not know the equipment is regulated," Wagner said. "But it happens."

The 25-foot Titanic slide tipped over and deflated Monday night in the school parking lot, 401 E. Ninth St.

Nine children were injured, none seriously. State officials said at least 11 children were on or near the slide when it tipped over.

The capacity, according to manufacturer's regulations, is four children - two on the stairs and two on the slide.

"That tells us the operator was improperly trained or that the slide was

not supervised at all," Wagner said, adding that sanctions would be forthcoming.

School officials have said the slide was supervised and insured. The school's PTA organized the event to reward students who participated in fund-raising activities during the school year.

Tim Melton, a representative of Mountain Marketing, said there were five

in tables at the carnival. Workers moved four inside the school's gymbecase of a threat of rain, Melton said. They left the slide in the parking lot. It was not clear late Thursday how the slide was anchored.

Bart Black, owner of Master Rental, called the preliminary findings "fair." When asked why he didn't know the inflatable slides were

regulated by the state, he declined comment. He would not say how long Master Rental has been operating in Asheville.

According to the company's Web site, Master Rental leases 12 inflatable reducts, including two slides, a dunking booth and an obstacle ourse.

"We're happy that no one was seriously hurt," Black said. "We're complying with authorities. I can't say anything else."

Melton also regrets the accident occurred.

"I want to find out exactly what happened, so it never happens again," he said.
